## 1 **S6 Joint University Programmes Admissions System (JUPAS)**

To assist S6 students with using the JUPAS online application system, the School will hold the Unique Goal Project on 8<sup>th</sup> October which will include a briefing session on the JUPAS online application system. Hong Kong students sitting for the Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education Exam can apply for the following programmes through JUPAS:

### 1.1 University Grants Committee (UGC) funded programmes

### 3 **S6 School Nominations Direct Admission Scheme**

The School Nominations Direct Admission Scheme (SNDAS) is introduced with the aim of recognising the talent of local secondary students that could not be fully assessed by the Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education (HKDSE) Examination. It is a “programme-student matching exercise” in essence that provides opportunities for secondary students who have demonstrated exceptional talents and interests in specific disciplines / areas to be considered for direct admission to local universities. The eight UGC-funded universities have designated a total of around 140 publicly-funded undergraduate programmes to participate in SNDAS in the 2022/23 academic year. 3.1 Quota: Each local secondary school has a quota of two nominations.

3.2 Procedures:

Students may in person submit the completed “application form of Principal’s Recommendation Scheme JUPAS (CGC\_form\_001)” and copies of relevant supporting documents to Mr. Ho Cho Ming (704BC) on or before 8<sup>th</sup> November. (You may collect the application form at the School Office.)

3.3 Interview :

Interviews will be arranged between 11<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> November. The results will be posted on the Careers Committee Bulletin Board near the Principal’s Office.

3.4 Remarks:

Given that the SNDAS will be implemented in parallel with the JUPAS route, students nominated for SNDAS should submit their JUPAS applications at the same time. Successful nominees will not be considered for other Principal’s recommendation schemes.

Participating universities will make firm offers to successful SNDAS student nominees in June 2022, prior to the release of the 2022 HKDSE Examination results.

Successful nominees must decide whether to accept the offer before the release of the 2022 HKDSE Examination results. Once accepted, the firm offer will be binding and they will not be considered / accepted by other programmes regardless of their HKDSE Examination results. Their JUPAS applications will automatically be removed from the JUPAS application system.

### 4 **Home-School Co-operation Prevention of Communicable Diseases**

The Centre for Health Protection (CHP) of the Department of Health has recently received increased reports of institutional URTI outbreaks. As schools are places of collective assembly, infectious diseases could easily spread among people through daily contacts. In this regard, the School should reinforce preventive measures and stay alert to students and staff with active symptoms so as to mitigate the impact of upper respiratory tract infection.

With the guidance of the CHP, the School has adopted the following measures:

4.1 The CHP of the Department of Health and the Education Bureau remind schools to reinforce preventive measures on the campus so as to prevent outbreaks of respiratory tract infection including COVID-19. Schools should check the body temperature of all students every day when they arrive at school so as to identify students with fever. Staff should also check their temperature before work every day. It is of prime importance that staff and children with fever (oral temperature higher than 37.5°C, or ear temperature higher than 38°C) should not be allowed to attend school, regardless of the presence of respiratory symptoms. They should consult a doctor promptly.




- 4.2 Since the symptoms of influenza-like illness (ILI) and URTI are similar to those of COVID-19, to be prudent, the schools with ILI or URTI outbreaks will be covered in the compulsory testing notice (CTN) to exclude the possibility of COVID-19 infection. The schools are required to suspend teaching activities for cleaning for 5 days. All students and staff are required to receive COVID-19 testing under CTN and must receive a negative test result before they are allowed to go back to school after the resumption of normal school days.
- 4.3 In addition, we would like to remind parents to keep home clean and follow the guidances provided by the CHP for prevention of upper respiratory tract infection:
- Surgical masks can prevent transmission of respiratory viruses from infected persons. It is essential for persons who are symptomatic (even if experiencing only mild symptoms) to wear a surgical mask;
  - Wear a surgical mask when taking public transport or staying in crowded places. It is important to wear a mask properly, including paying attention to hand hygiene before wearing and after removing a mask.
  - Avoid touching eyes, nose and mouth;
  - Wash hands with liquid soap and water properly whenever there is the possibility of contamination;
  - When hands are not visibly soiled, clean them with 70 to 80 per cent alcohol-based handrub;
  - Cover the nose and mouth when sneezing or coughing; Dispose of soiled tissue paper properly in a lidded rubbish bin and wash hands thoroughly afterwards;
  - When experiencing respiratory symptoms, wear a surgical mask, refrain from work or attending class at school, avoid going to crowded places and seek medical advice promptly; and;
  - Maintain a balanced diet, exercise regularly, take adequate rest, do not smoke and avoid overstress.
